

# Pastor's Corner

This month is the beginning of Lent, starting with Ash Wednesday and ending with Holy Saturday. It is forty days – a time of reflection as we contemplate the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness resisting Satan.

Traditionally, this has been a time focused on prayer, fasting, abstinence, almsgiving, and repentance. But as we reflect on our Lord's suffering and death, we know the joy of Easter – the celebration of Jesus' conquest of death, sin, and the devil awaits us.

Now here is a fun fact about Easter. Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday are 46 days. However, the six Sundays are exempted as Sundays were always considered Feast days! I learned that as a child from a Catholic friend. He had given up (as often traditional among Catholics) soda for Lent but always delighted in his Sunday sodas! I later confirmed that as an adult as one did not want to put too much confidence in another 10-year-old.



#### A Note on St. Patrick's Day

"My name is Patrick. I am a sinner..."

Curiously, like most of his legend, St. Patrick is not even truly a saint. He has never been canonized by the Roman Catholic Church. Patrick himself told us he was a sinner, not a saint.

Patrick was a crusader, seeking to convert Ireland from Paganism after being held captive by pirates for nearly 6 years. Patrick brought Christianity to Ireland and planted churches; the first which is where he died.

While there are many legends and traditions surrounding Saint Patrick and March 17, Patrick was a crusader for Christ and that is worth celebrating!
